### Minutes of the Executive Meeting of PHRF-LO held at RYC on February 6, 1993.

**Present:** John Smart, President; Bill Visser, Secretary/Treasurer;

Handicapper.

The following topics were discussed.

1 - Office setup for Diana Riley

When Diana assumed the PHRF-LO equipment in her role as Executive Assistant, additional facilities were required to house this equipment. Diana is looking for some expense relief for this.

Decision: Bill will discuss with Diana the additional overhead incurred and arrive at a mutual agreement.

2 - U.S. Sailing participation

The concern here was that considering the amount that was paid to US Sailing annually, were we getting our money's worth?

Decision: Monitor what we do get, and re-evaluate before the next AGM.

3 - Boat Standards.

The issue here was that there are several boats with duplicate titles. Should we not standardize this?

Decision: This is something the Chief Handicapper should look into. This may be a make-work project, since districts may continue to assign new names for their area, then later find that another district has selected a different name.

4 - Canadian Yachting Association OffShore Committee

Question was raised as to whether or not PHRF-LO should become involved with the subject committee. This may be a benefit to us in achieving national standards.

Decision: Since we really do not know too much about the purpose of the committee, or their objectives, nothing should be done until this information is gathered.

5 - Review of Executive structure.

Due to the absence of Pat Lymburner, no discussion. This will be passed on to the new Vice President.

6 - Golden Horseshoe District Chief

Steve Cramer reported that Ian Thompson has assumed responsibilities as the District Chief.

7 - New Chief Handicapper

Discussions were held on who should be asked to act as new Chief Handicapper. Consideration was given to moving the position around the Lake, so that input at the executive level can have a wider scope.

Decision: Yvonne Parlour would be asked, and if agreeable would be nominated as the new Chief Handicapper.
